Purpose

For Council to consider the Board of Variance (BOV) Report and attached documentation to use as reference for the implementation of a City of Grand Forks Board of Variance.

Background

On November 28, 2022, Council approved the following resolution:

THAT Council approve DVP2206 to relax the rear parcel line setback of 7316 Donaldson Drive from 6 metres to 3.1 metres; AND THAT Staff bring back a report on the Board of Variance.

Following the resolution Staff began the information gathering process regarding the BOV. The BOV information compilation is part of this report and attachments are based on it.

Board of Variance Summary

A Board of Variance (BOV) is part of the local government land use management system established by Part 14 of the Local Government Act. The BOV deals with appeals for minor variances, where compliance with the Zoning Regulation Bylaw or other applicable bylaws would cause undue hardship. The BOV also deals with matters regarding additions and structural alterations to non-conforming buildings. Most applications deal with permitted building height or the required distance between a building or part of a building and an adjacent parcel boundary. In these cases, the requirement for a BOV application will mostly have been identified by the review of a building permit application.

The BOV cannot deal with matters related to land use, density limits, parking variances or landscape variance.

The BOV consists of up to three members appointed by City Council to a three-year term; elected City officials and City staff are not permitted to sit on the Board of Variance. The City's appointees may be removed at any time by resolution of Council. A joint BOV may be established with two or more local governments by establishing a board of variance together by bylaw adopted by all participating local governments.

Applications to the BOV are considered at public meetings of the board, of which written notifications are given.

BOV decisions are final. However, unsuccessful applicants may apply to Council for a local government permit that changes the regulation in question; individual hardship is not a required element of such applications. BOV decisions may also be reviewed by the B.C. Supreme Court, on technical justice terms, on the terms that the board exceeded its jurisdiction in making the order, or on the terms that the decision is unreasonable.
