

# FINANCES



We received \$60,000.00 from the City as well as \$24,798.00 for the RDKB funding.

At this time, we have approx. \$55,000.00 for operating with a further \$30,000.00 coming from the City in Nov.

We also have another \$51,000.00 in Savings. Approx. \$20,000 of that we have received through grants for specific projects.

We also have the \$50,000.00 given to the Museum from the family of Donald Reid. The money is in a Legacy Fund Saving Account. We feel it should be used for a project that would enhance the Museum for years to come.

We are running very close to our projected Revenues and Expenditures from the 2023 Budget and there for will see a short fall of approx. \$30,000.00 which we will need to take out of saving.
